St. Columba, pray for us.






Land Acknowledgement

Academic Excellence

- For the last 3 years (starting 2021-22 school year), we average between 85-90% for post-secondary attendance
- 2021-2022: STEM and Business programs (both college and university) made up 50% of our applicants' choices
- 2022-2023: STEM and Business programs (both college and university) made up 70% our applicants' choices.
- 2023-2024: STEM and Business programs (both college and university) made up 50% our applicants' choices.





Uniform


- Full uniform is expected at all times during the school day including the lunch period. All non uniform attire is to be stored in the student's locker.










Regional Arts
