## TIPS FOR CHOOSING GRADE 12 COURSES

## Things to consider.

- Complete your 40 hrs. community service and literacy test requirements before grade 12
- Ensure compulsory credits required for diploma are selected with a total minimum of 30 credits \*English ("ENG") and Religion are compulsory for Grade 12
- Application Process for University/College begins in November-December
- For Apprenticeship Programs = check program specific prerequisites
- For College "Diploma" Admission = diploma with ENG4C1 plus program specific prerequisites
- Check specific College program prerequisites at www.ontariocolleges.ca
- For University or College "Degree" Admission = diploma with ENG4U1 plus a minimum of 5 additional "4U" or "4M" (university level pre-req) courses (for top 6 average "admission" calculation)
- For specific university program admission information/statistics see <a href="https://www.electronicinfo.ca">www.electronicinfo.ca</a>. Compare similar programs at ALL universities of interest since requirements do vary.
- When universities "recommend" a course we strongly recommend that you take the course to be better prepared for that university program
- Be sure to check whether <u>additional criteria</u> is required for program admission such as additional testing, auditions, portfolio reviews, personal statements etc.
